



Remote Learning Advice & FAQs

We understand that this is a difficult time and that many parents now find themselves thinking about how best to continue their child's education whilst at home. We have put together a list of **F**requently **A**sksed **Q**uestions that we hope will give you some advice and guidelines.

Where can I find information about what my child should be learning?

- Parent Emails - will be used to share information and send out learning resources and links.
- 'Class Dojo' - will enable pupils to 'chat', share work and celebrate successes. 'Class Story' will share key information with parents, whilst the 'Portfolio' can be used to post your child's work for feedback and celebration.
- 'Zoom' - will be the main platform used for daily 'live teaching'.
- Oak Academy - is one of a number of sites that might be used to support teaching and learning.

Where should I put the work when completed?

- Foundation Stage work and photos can be uploaded to Tapestry, in the normal way.
- All other year groups are using 'Class Dojo'. You can upload work onto your child's portfolio by taking a photo or video. Your child's teacher and leaders within the school can also see every child's portfolio.

Do I need to print off lots of the work from the websites?

No, this is not necessary. Where a hard copy of any printed materials is needed, this can be made available for 'covid-safe' collection from the main office weekly. (Work can then be returned to the teacher for marking and feedback, on collection of a 'learning pack' the following week.)

What if my child finds the work too hard or too easy?

- If a child is struggling with work within the 'live teaching' session, they can raise their hand or ask the Teaching Assistant for help on the chat function.
- If a child is struggling to complete the work independently following the teaching session, they can contact their teacher on 'Class Dojo'.
- If, outside of our live sessions, you need further support, please join in with our learning surgery and someone will be able to talk you through everything you need for your learning.

Can my child still take a book quiz whilst at home?

You can also use AR Bookfinder, which is a great search tool to look for books that are on the AR system.

What do I do if we do not have any suitable reading books at home for our children?

On our website, under your child's year group page, we have a great link to 'Oxford Owl' that has some great free eBooks to read online.

How can I manage time if I have more than one child at home?

This can be a real challenge, especially when you are trying to get your head around how your children should be carrying out their learning. Try starting 'Maths time' with one of your children and then giving them some questions to practise by themselves while you move on to support your other child / children.

Alternatively, one child could be enjoying some quiet time activities, while you support the other. There may be some things they can enjoy together, like story time. Enlist the help of older siblings too - they can be your personal assistants!

Our 'live teaching' sessions will be recorded where possible and uploaded to 'Class Dojo'. This will mean that even if a device is not available in the home for all children at the same time, they can watch the session back later.

How should I structure my child's day?

Children like routine, so if you can keep to a similar structure most days, this will help your child feel more relaxed. The daily 'live learning' session structure will help with this. We have provided some examples on our website of how you can break up your day into smaller chunks, allowing for outdoor / physical time, creative time, learning time and family time.

If I want to speak to a member of staff about the curriculum / learning, is there anyone I can contact?
