Maths

Over the last few weeks, the children in Year 2 have worked hard on understanding and solving problems involving place value. Their learning included: partitioning numbers into tens and ones, identifying the value of digits, reasoning with number lines and ordering numbers.

English

In English, we have use The Gruffalo as our core text. We have written a description of the Gruffalo, directions on how to find the Gruffalo and lastly, instructions on how to make 'Gruffalo Knobbly Knees'. I think you can say, they enjoyed eating the knobbly knees too! The children are working hard to spell key vocabulary accurately, correctly punctuating sentences and making sure all the sentences make sense. In reading, we are focusing on accuracy and fluency.
