Maths

Over the last few weeks, the children in Year 4 have been working hard on their addition and subtraction skills to mentally add hundreds and thousands to a four digit number. Then we moved on to using column addition methods to add 4 digit numbers by practicing representing our numbers with place value counters first, then using these to show our exchanging. We are continuing to practice our times tables in school and have had many TT Rockstars competitions!

English

In English, we have been enjoying our new class book 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane' and discussing how the main character can make better choices! In our writing, we have just started our new unit on 'George's Marvellous Medicine' by Roald Dahl. We have invented our own potions to make Grandma kinder and are currently writing a persuasive advert using powerful adjectives, Imagine 3 sentences and inverted commas for customer reviews.

Science

In Science, the children finished our electricity unit by investigating how the number of bulbs impact the brightness.

Foundation Subjects

In our history sessions, we finished our unit by holding a class debate on who should be the next king in 1066. The children researched the three potential kings, evaluated their personal qualities and debated why their king was the best candidate!

In French, we have been using French adjectives for size, personality, eye and hair colour to describe our friends in the class. We used our new vocabulary knowledge to build sentence and held our very own life sized Guess Who game.
