

# BRAYBROOK Year 3 Fortnightly Newsletter

#### **Maths**

Over the last two weeks, the children in Year 3 have been working on our understanding of division as well as scaling and calculating combinations. We have begun to think about measuring length this week and have been exploring how to measure with accuracy in mm, cm and metres.

### **English**

In English, we have been using our whole class text, "Escape from Pompeii," by Christina Balit to complete some brilliant narratives and have now begun a unit of poetry exploring various poetic features building towards writing poems about a volcano.

#### **Science**

In our science sessions, the children have continued to explore rocks and soils by investigating where fossils are found. We also had the opportunity to investigate the speed of drainage in different types of soil and consider how this can affect real-world decisions regarding the use of soil.

## **Foundation Subjects**

In History, we have continued to learn about the Romans in Britain by exploring the legacy of what they left behind, as well as an in depth look at the nature of Roman armour compared to the Celts they fought against. In Music, we have continued learning about pentatonic scales and even had the chance to compose our own variations of pentatonic melodies.

In Art, we have continued to explore shading techniques in order to produce some wonderful technical drawings of plants in the style of Charles Darwin and have also begun creating our own larger abstract art pieces using all of the techniques we have learned.

In French we have built on our learning about French numbers by playing some traditional French games. You may have seen our French version of Hopscotch outside the classroom!
